# EAST SQUAD NOTES

Three running backs for the East—Otis Armstrong of Purdue, Dick Jauron of Yale, and Steve Jones of Duke—ran for more than 2½ miles on the ground during their 1972 season . . . the three-some gained 4652 yards in 690 carries for an average of 6.7 yards per carry . . . Armstrong gained 1361 yards, Jones 1236 yards, and Jauron 1055 yards.

Armstrong established an all-time Big Ten rushing record for three years with a total of 3315 yards, the sixth highest in NCAA history . . . Gary Huff, Florida State quarterback, was the number two ranking passer in total yards this year . . . he threw for 2893 yards and 25 touchdowns, including 69 completions to his East teammate, wide receiver Barry Smith . . . Dick Jauron, Yale's outstanding back, in addition to his football exploits, was recently honored as a scholar-athlete . . . he is known in New England football circles as a "jack-of-all-trades," having run for over 1000 yards in just 160 carries, adding field goals and extra points, and returning kickoffs.

Remember such famous Duke Blue Devil running backs as Ace Parker, George McAfee, and Eric Tipton in years gone by . . . all were nationally-known in years gone by. Running back Steve Jones has erased their record this year, despite missing six games in his three-year career. In addition, Jones is the fourteenth-ranked punter in NCAA records this year—65 punts for a 41.3 average.

Offensive guard Ed Newman of Duke is a two-time winner of the conference wrestling title . . . many of the East college stars, as well as the West players, work with underprivileged youth in their respective area. Two that come to mind are Temple's Bill (Skip) Singletary, offensive guard, and John LeHeup, South Carolina defensive end. Joe Injaychock, Temple defensive back who was a late replacement on the East team, played against Mike Siani, a rookie sensation with the Oakland Raiders this year . . . Mike needed one more touchdown catch to break a school record, but Joe held Mike to one pass reception all day—and it wasn't a touchdown.

Fred Grambau, Michigan defensive lineman, has played in two Rose Bowl games . . . he played as a sophomore three years ago, sat out 1970 with a knee injury, came back in 1971 (the Wolverines lost to Stanford) . . . The East roster includes seven first-team All-Americans named by the American Football Coaches Association—Dave Butz, Purdue; Dick Jauron, Yale; John LeHeup, South Carolina; Randy Logan, Michigan; Paul Seymour, Michigan; Barry Smith, Florida State; and Brad Van Pelt, Michigan State.

# WEST SQUAD NOTES

Calvin Jones, Washington's outstanding defensive back, and Cody Jones, San Jose State's fine defensive tackle, both played high school football in San Francisco . . . Iowa State's quarterback George Amundson, was a quarterback as a sophomore; moved to running back as a junior, gained 1316 yards; and then returned to quarterback this year as he ran and passed for over 2000 yards.

Bill Bartley, Oregon State defensive back, led the Pac-8 in pass interceptions this year with 8 . . . Isaac Curtis, who started his football career at California, and shifted to San Diego State, is rated by Aztec coach Don Coryell as "better than previous Aztec receivers Gary Garrison and Haven Moses, both No. 1 draft picks by the NFL . . . Curtis is a world-class sprinter, but passed up chance for 1972 Olympic Games to play football.

Paul Howard is from upstate Redding, went to Brigham Young on a basketball scholarship . . . Puddin' Jones (Houston) first name is Nathaniel . . . Bruce Barnes, UCLA kicker, led the Pac-8 for three straight years—three-year average of 41.8 yards per punt, including 43.3 in 1972.

Co-holders of pass-catching honors Pac-8 this year are both with the West team—Steve Sweeney of California, and Greg Specht of Oregon . . . both caught 52 passes this year . . . Sweeney had 13 touchdown passes in 1972 to set new Pac-8 record, including nine in the last five games . . . offensive tackle Bruce Walton of UCLA is the older brother of UCLA basketball star, Bill Walton, who received national honors with the NCAA-champion Bruins as a sophomore last year.

Long Beach State running back Terry Metcalf scored 29 touchdowns as a junior, more than any other back in the nation . . . then suffered an Achilles heel injury during his senior year, and missed quite a few games . . . he wound up the season in a blaze of glory though, scoring five touchdowns in his final game.

Jim Merlo, West linebacker, and Bruce Barnes, West kicker, were high school teammates at Sanger High School in the San Joaquin Valley . . . Merlo went to Stanford, Barnes to UCLA . . . Calvin Jones, Washington's fine defensive back, tossed a quick and humorous line back to Bob Hope when he appeared on the latter's TV show with the Associated Press All-America team . . . rehearsed, of course!

Linebacker Steve Brown of Oregon State was the only West player to make the Consensus All-America team, a compilation of nine All-America teams.
