EAST SQUAD NOTES

Two East schools are represented in the East-West game for the first time—the University of the Pacific, is the 49-year history of the game—Ball State of Muncie, Ind., and the University of Richmond (Virginia) ... defensive back Terry Schmidt represents Ball State; 238-lb. running back, Barty Smith, is Richmond's first player ... Norris Weese, the Mississippi quarterback, is adept in the classroom as well as on the field. He carries a 3.8 grade average in his classes, and was one of eleven Scholar-Athletes named this year by the National Football Foundation and Hall of Fame ... Dave Gallagher, Michigan defensive tackle, is also a 1973 Scholar-Athlete.

Gary Marangi, the Boston College quarterback (incidentally, he and Weese both led their schools to fine seasons in '73), is only the second B.C. quarterback to ever play in the East-West game. ... Mark van Eeghen, the Colgate runner with over 1000 yards gained this season, has been called the 'best Colgate back in history.' ... and that includes Marv Hubbard, the fine running back of the Oakland Raiders.

Don Clune, the speedy Pennsylvania wide receiver, once gained 294 yards by passes ... it was against Harvard, but Penn lost, 28-27 ... Clune is outstanding track man, and scored 6700 points the first time he tried the decathlon ... nickname of Tennessee State's defensive lineman, Ed Jones, is "Too Tall" ... he stands 6-9, and weighs 264 lbs. ...

Three of the East backs have a total of 36 touchdowns scored between them this season ... van Eeghen scored 15, Barty Smith 14, and Charles Young of No. Carolina State added 7—total 36 ... Chuck Ramsey of Wake Forest led the nation in punting this year with a 44-yard plus average ...

Congratulations to Tom Forrest, University of Cincinnati guard, and the aforementioned Barty Smith. ... Forrest has been very active in Cincinnati youth work, and spent last summer in Cincinnati working with underprivileged youngsters, while Smith is active in the Big Brother movement in Richmond ... another "Bubba"—James McCollum, the Kentucky defensive lineman, is nicknamed "Bubba." ... last year's tongue-twister for the most difficult name to pronounce was Joe De La Mielieure of Michigan State (he had a good year opening holes for O. J. Simpson with the Buffalo Bills) ... this year the East gets the "tongue-twisting" laurels as ... it's Carl Barzilauskas, a 268-lb. defensive tackle from Indiana.

WEST SQUAD NOTES

Larry Bailey, the East Palo Alto punter who was a defensive stalwart at the University of the Pacific, is the first Pacific player in the East-West game since Bob Lee made it as a punter in 1967 ... the two West quarterbacks, David Jaynes of Kansas and Mike Boryla of Stanford, have thrown 66 touchdown passes in their careers—35 for Jaynes, and 31 for Boryla. ... David Atkinson, Brigham Young defensive back, set a school record for interceptions with 19. ...

U.C. at Riverside is represented in the East-West game for the first time ... Mike Basinger, a defensive lineman from Los Banos, Calif., has the honor.

Speaking of Jaynes, he had only nine of his passes intercepted during the entire 1973 season ... that's one interception every 36½ tosses ... he once threw for 401 yards against Jim Sweeney's Washington State Cougars (bet Sweeney, head coach for this year's West team, is glad to have him on his side this time) ...

Berkeley High gives the East-West game Steve Odom, who set all sorts of records at the University of Utah ... the 5-9 Odom was called "the most dangerous runner to ever wear a Utah uniform" ... he holds three NCAA kickoff return records, including total yardage for one season—1228 yards ... he scored 11 touchdowns this year, and almost all of them were for long distance gains, from 41 yards to 95 yards ... he can score from anywhere on the field, as can a number of other players in the game. ...

Ted Seifert, the California tackle, has an added incentive in the game ... his sister was a patient at the Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children for many years. ... Ted Wickert, Washington State offensive tackle, is another bay area boy—he prepped at Redwood High over in Marin county. ... Rod Garcia, Stanford place-kicker, holds the record for career field goals in the NCAA—44, but only 42 count as the others were in the Rose Bowl ... he had a 59-yarder against USC this year that set a Stanford, Pac-8, and L.A. Coliseum record. ... Garcia was born in Chile. ... Matt Blair of Iowa State was born in Hilo, Hawaii. ...

Biggest man on either team is UCLA defensive tackle Bill Sandifer at 285 lbs. ... Don Fambrough, the Kansas coach and assistant coach for today's game, is another East-West player who has returned to the game in a coaching capacity. ... Fambrough was a guard in the 1947 East-West game ... there approximately 20 former players who returned to the game as coaches.
